

# PROTECT SPECIES ACTIVELY by LIFE



The Czech Republic is struggling with loss of biodiversity. The PROSPECTIVE LIFE project is here to help, ensuring better protection of plants, fungi, and animals. Its ambition is to improve the condition of the Czech countryside, preserve and increase its biodiversity, and reverse the decline of the most endangered species within ten years. It focuses on an active approach combined with targeted management of species and habitats. It involves awareness-raising, education, and communication. It will help with the implementation of important EU regulations and strategies for the protection of biodiversity into our legal system.

By 2033, it will bring **€39,702,379** to the protection of our native wildlife.

## What will the project bring?

- ✓ more effective protection of plants, fungi and animals, and improvement of the condition of the Czech countryside
- ✓ greater public involvement in the protection of biodiversity and pollinators
- ✓ management needed for our most endangered species and better conditions for pollinators
- ✓ better communication between nature conservation authorities and more efficient financing of nature and countryside management
